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REQUIREMENTS FOR TOURNAMENT AND SELECTION PROCESS:

1. This is a great opportunity for our athletes to compete at the national level. This is a **mandatory** tournament for athletes selected, that wish to compete for Team BC or Team Canada. It will be a requirement in the selection process for wrestlers that will be chosen for these teams, by the head coach.
2. **Team Selection** – BC will enter two teams into this tournament: BC(A) and BC(B). Those who placed first at War on the Floor Elite 2011 (WOF), will be automatically selected for team BC(A). Team BC(B) will consist of those who placed second at the same tournament. In the event that those automatically selected cannot attend the tournament, the coach will select who will go in place. Those who will wrestle for BC(A) and BC(B) **must** be present at the 2011 Christmas Camp at SFU.
3. In the event that an athlete has competed in a weight class at WOF, and does not belong to a weight class applicable at the Stu Hart, he may be eligible for a wrestle-off during the 2011 Christmas Camp at SFU. The wrestle-off will be against the winner of the weight class one above his, and he cannot move down to a lower weight class. To be eligible for the wrestle-off, the athlete must be a gold medalist at the WOF. Other criteria for eligibility will also be based on ability to compete, camp attendance, and training, as decided by the developmental coach. These rules also apply for Team BC(A) and Team BC(B).
4. **Injury Provision** – If an athlete is injured prior to the WOF and does not compete, he may also be eligible for a wrestle-off at the Christmas Camp. This will be based on approval by the coach. To be eligible, the athlete must be a medalist at nationals or a provincial champion. If this criteria is not met then he may appeal, and this will be determined by the coach.
